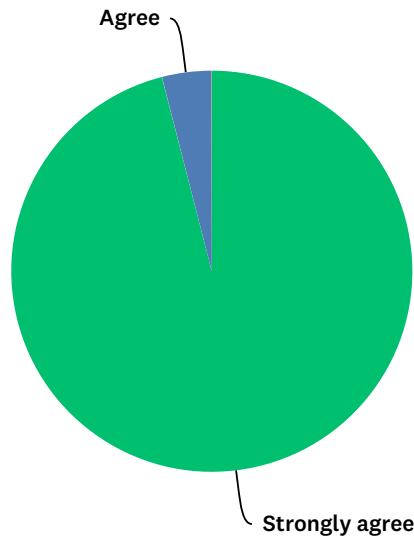


Q1 Has this Disability Equality Training enhanced your knowledge/skills?

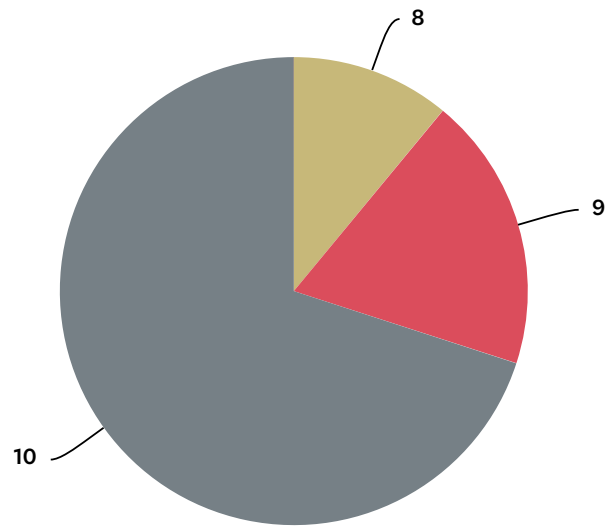
